# Words from Home...

It is hard to believe that school has started again. Thank you so much for contributing to the Back-to-School campaign. Our children will have all the supplies they need this year because of your generous support.

Fall is such a great time at the Children's Home. The children enjoy playing outside, riding their bikes on campus, going to football games, and more. It is also exciting because our churches provide all the food our children need through the Fall Food Roundup. Thank you for meeting those needs.

This is also the time when our staff presents the Annual Children's Home Report to the Churches at their associational meetings. Hopefully, we will see many of you then. Let me give you a preview of that report. This past year you provided love, care, and hope for over 8,000 children, families, and others. Many of those precious people experienced the joy of salvation in Christ.

Through our residential child and family care ministries we served 127 children and 27 homeless mothers. An additional 194 families received placement referral services.

Our Granberry Counseling centers provided services for 914 clients through 12 offices around the state. Our Minister Care Counseling Program provided 36 Louisiana Baptist minister families with counseling services which were paid through a partnership with the Pastoral Leadership division of the Louisiana Baptist Convention.

Our Women's Learning Center (formally Christian Women's Job Corps) provided

34 women with educational and job skills training. An additional 126 women were provided with support services. Additional certifications including Paraprofessional Education and Banking Services were added to the curriculum.

Our Compassion for Kids ministry served over 2,000 economically challenged children and families in northeast Louisiana by providing life essentials such as household items, coats, shoes, and more. All Compassion for Kids projects are conducted through partnerships with local Baptist churches and ministries.

Finally, our international ministry, Orphans Embrace, served 22 children at the Children's Village in Croix des Bouquets, Haiti. The children are doing well in the midst of challenging times. We also served over 5,000 additional children by providing shoes through our various ministry partners. Please continue to pray for our work in Haiti.

I can't leave you without telling you about \*Beth. Her story is much like the rest of our children. She could not continue to live with her family. She had little or no church involvement before coming to the Home. Beth is a very smart and inquisitive girl. As she attended church and saw the living faith of those on our staff, Beth was drawn to learning more about Jesus. Through discussions with her cottage parents and others, she realized her need for Christ and accepted Him as her Savior and Lord. Thank you for being an important part of Beth's decision.

If you haven't been on campus for a tour lately, the Fall is a great time to come and see what God is doing through your generous support. Thank you again for meeting needs and changing lives at your Louisiana Baptist Children's Home. God bless.

# Campus Spotlight...

## Lexi, Zander and Ryver "HomePlace is your support."

The HomePlace Ministry has been a helpful next step for Lexi and her children, Ryver (3), and Zander (2). Lexi lived in a faith-based recovery home for a time, working toward sobriety and a better life for herself and her children. It was while she was a resident there that she learned about HomePlace Ministry which would allow her to have her children with her.

Lexi recalls her move-in day. One of the first people she met at Irma's Place was Ms. Trudy, the Relief Cottage Manager. "She was there when we arrived, and she was very welcoming. She helped me unpack but she also gave me my space, which really meant a lot to me," says Lexi. "I was glad she was there, but I was a little nervous, too, being in this new place."

Deborah Johnson, Cottage Manager, was also very welcoming to Lexi and her boys and has continued to be an important presence in their lives. "Ms. Deborah helps me with a lot of struggles," says Lexi. One of her first priorities has been parenting. "As a young mom, I would like to be a good parent and don't always feel sure about what I'm doing. When Ryver all of a sudden started acting out, Ms. Deborah helped me work through that. He's doing great now, and Ms. Deborah is so good with Ryver and Zander." Lexi is thankful that Deborah has been there as a mentor and a friend. In addition to that one-on-one support, Lexi is looking forward to the parenting and other classes that are part of the HomePlace Ministry.

The boys enjoy daycare while their mom is at work. "During the week, after we get home, there's only time to eat and take baths, and then it's bedtime," says Lexi. "But on weekends, we love to be outdoors. We go to Kiroli Park sometimes or Black Bayou or the zoo. One day, we saw a snake at the Forsythe boat launch! Ryver and Zander—well, we were all excited. They were more excited than scared," she laughs.

Lexi adds, "The boys love dinosaurs, too, and building blocks. They have a little place to play while I'm cleaning and doing my chores, and they love that. I wouldn't know what to do or how to do some of these things if we were in any other environment. This has been so good for us."

Lexi, Ryver, and Zander have found a church home at White's Ferry Road where Lexi participates in the Celebrate Recovery Step Study. Lexi enjoys her personal Bible study time in the mornings and evenings. As she grows in her faith, there are a couple of verses that she considers to be affirmations in her journey:

*"The LORD will make you the head, not the tail. If you pay attention to the commands of the LORD your God that I give you this day and carefully follow them, you will always be at the top, never at the bottom" (Deuteronomy 28:13 NIV).*

*"... we are more than conquerors through him who loved us" (Romans 8:37 NIV).*



Lexi shares that she was 15 when her struggles with addiction began. She wonders, at times, if her future might hold opportunities for her to work with teenagers as a counselor or therapist. She feels her first-hand experiences could be the catalyst to help young people make better decisions and avoid some of the experiences she's been through. For those who have made those unwise choices, she also has a testimony of hope to share with them.

For now, Lexi really enjoys her job at a cookie dough factory. She has just been promoted to a quality assurance position and is looking forward to this opportunity to expand her responsibilities.

Deborah is proud of Lexi and the progress she's made. "Lexi is a very good mother. I never have to ask her to do her chores, laundry or clean her room. She is eager to save money. She came to HomePlace very motivated and prepared to move forward into her future. She is very committed to developing a good life for herself and her boys."

Lexi is such a believer in HomePlace that she has shared her experiences with a friend who will soon be joining the program. "We talked about it, and she has been interviewed. I told her that it's amazing and the homes are beautiful. It will be good for her and her baby. HomePlace has really helped me. It's very structured and, for me, I just enjoy the structure. I'm learning to be more independent, and that's been my goal since I've become a mother."

While she still has a few things to conquer, Lexi is ready to embrace those challenges. She's excited about the future for herself and her family. She's thankful for the encouragement she's found and, as Lexi shared with her friend, "HomePlace is your support."



# Compassion for Kids Ministry Partners with Churches to Help Children...

It's such an exciting season for Louisiana Baptist Children's Home & Family Ministries! In 2022, LBCHFM expanded its Compassion For Kids ministry by bringing in a Mobile Compassion Trailer to serve impoverished children and families in northeast Louisiana. In the past few years, we have partnered with Pastor Don White of New Jerusalem Baptist Church in Calhoun to provide weekend food backpacks for children at Calhoun Elementary School. While that partnership has continued, this year our staff has taken the Mobile Compassion Trailer to two local church events.

In July, our staff partnered with Pastor Justin Clark and members of First West Fairbanks in Sterlington for a back to school event. LBCHFM provided 35 healthy household kits (5-gallon kits) and 50 Bibles to residents of the Village community. A few weeks later, in August, LBCHFM staff partnered with Pastor John Russell and members of Greater New Antioch Baptist Church in Monroe for another back to school event. This time, 100 backpacks loaded with school supplies were provided to families, along with 85 Bibles.

It has been so exciting to partner with churches in Northeast Louisiana to serve our communities! Compassion For Kids will join one more event in 2022, and plans are in development to take the Mobile Compassion Trailer to more events in 2023. Thank you to our staff who have served and to those who have supported this ministry through prayers and giving. God is doing great things!

## Fall Food Roundup: An Operation of Baptist Cooperation

According to the history books, the beginning of our Fall Food Roundup is not exactly clear. In 1917, in the report to the state convention from what was then the Louisiana Baptist Orphanage, reference is made to the "custom in former years" to run railroad cars over the Kansas City Southern, Iron Mountain, and Southern Pacific Railroads from all points along these lines to Lake Charles (the location of the Orphanage, 1903-1925). The purpose of the special railroad cars was to receive contributions of food and clothing for the children in the orphanage.

This indicates that the initial Roundup was at some time prior to 1917. Apparently, the Roundup began during John N. Shealy's tenure as the third superintendent of the Orphanage. He served from 1911 to 1916. Reference in subsequent reports mentioned the Thanksgiving season as the time for these contributions to be made.

Thirty years later, during D. C. Black's administration, the 1946 report to the convention stated that donations were received during the Fall Food Roundup when trucks went around the state to gather food donated by the people in the churches for the children in the Home.

Rev. Black, and the other superintendents before him, understood the importance of cooperation. They knew in their time, what Southern Baptists still know today: churches working together can accomplish so much more than what one church can accomplish alone.

This year's Fall Food Roundup is a great example. In just fourteen days, LBCH cottage dads and maintenance staff will drive across the state,

stopping at 450 collection points, and picking up over twenty U-Haul truck loads of non-perishable groceries, paper products, and cleaning supplies. Hundreds of LBC churches will participate. What an operation of cooperation among so many Louisiana Baptists!

Think about it. Someone in each of those churches will get the Fall Food Roundup information we send out, take the initiative to organize the efforts in their church, and communicate the need to their congregation. A whole bunch of church members will choose to make their contribution of Fall Food Roundup items needed. Then someone will coordinate getting the collection of food from their church to the appropriate pick-up point.

Does it work perfectly? No. There are always a few glitches along the way. Does it work well? Yes, amazingly well! Why? Because God impresses the need upon the hearts of Louisiana Baptists to cooperate with Him in accomplishing something significant for the Kingdom. There are no insignificant contributions – only cooperative contributions. And God works through those cooperative efforts to provide the non-perishable food needs for your Louisiana Baptist Children's Home for an entire year!

We're not sure when our Fall Food Roundup got started – we're just thankful it did! And we are grateful for the vision and generosity of Louisiana Baptists, who have cooperated with our heavenly Father in providing for the needs of children who cannot care for themselves. Thank you, Louisiana Baptists, for your compassion and cooperation!

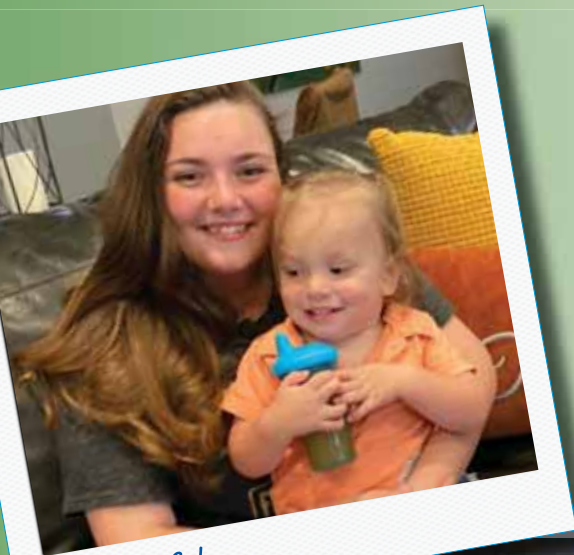

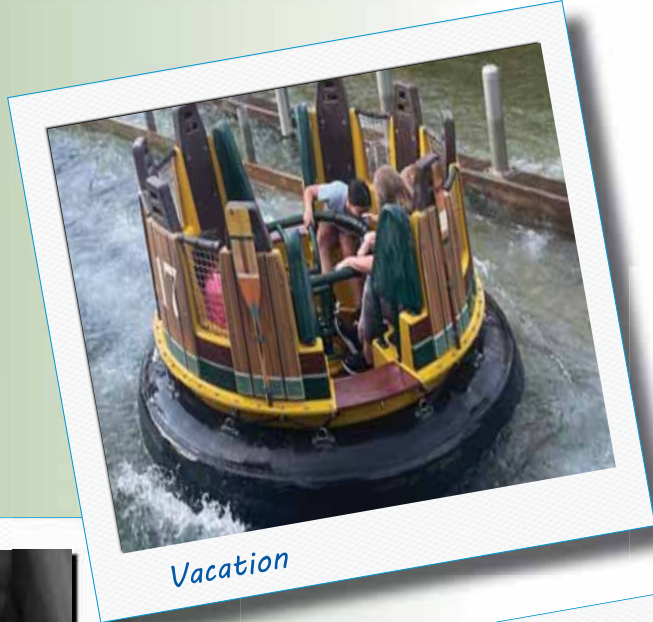

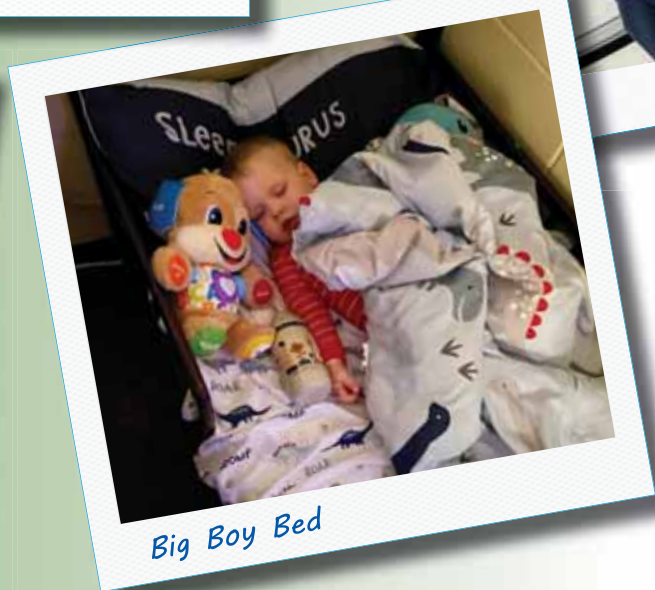

Louisiana Baptist Children's Home & Family Ministries is a faith-based 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization dedicated to providing love, care, and hope in Christ for children and families in need. Established in 1899, the Children's Home is an agency of the Louisiana Baptist Convention and is governed by a 17-member board of trustees elected by the Convention to serve three-year terms on a rotating basis.

The Children's Home is recognized by the Louisiana Department of Children and Family Services (DCFS) as a "Foster Care Community." Most of the children in LBCH foster homes are placed by DCFS and the other children are privately placed by a legal guardian.

The Children's Home receives no state or federal funding. Approximately 74% of all funding comes from individuals and churches. Less than 25% of funding goes to administrative costs; 75% goes to direct ministry services. Less than 7% of funding comes from payment of services.

Our major service areas include: Residential Child Care for Children ages 5-17; HomePlace Residential Family Care for Homeless Children and Mothers; Women's Learning Center providing job and life skills training and certified HiSET preparation and testing; Granberry Counseling Centers with 12 statewide locations; Connect1Child Foster Care & Adoption Ministries; and Orphans Embrace International.

Our dedicated Christian ministry team strives to offer the highest quality of services. Services are provided without regard to race, gender, religion, or ability to pay.
